





Chicago's growing race gap in per capita income
















Changes in Wages for Full-Time, Full-Year Male







The good news: Graduation rates for CPS students have increased substantially over time...




2016 5-Year High School Graduation for CPS Students








When do shootings happen?




Exposure to a homicide within 2500 feet of the home address increased mental health symptoms by 43%, a highly significant effect.


Homicide Rate in Chicago, 1985-2019





Homicide Rate in Lincoln Park, 1985-2019





Homicide Rate in Garfield Park, 1985-2019




